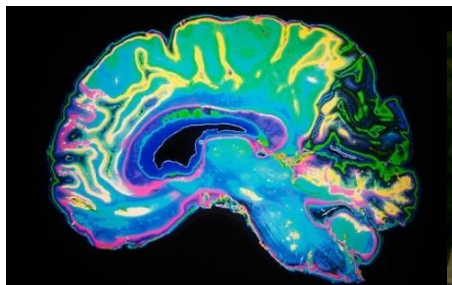


Are you interested in brain research? We are looking for siblings of OCD-affected children

Researchers at BC Children's Hospital are conducting a study on obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD) and how this affects the brain. Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) is a non-invasive method of taking pictures of the internal body including the brain; it does not involve any radiation or x-rays.



We invite girls and boys who are:

- Siblings of a children diagnosed with OCD
- Between 6-18 years old
- Fluent in English
- Without braces
- Interested in receiving pictures of their own brain!

What it involves:

- 1-2 hour interview
- 3-hour MRI appointment (~2 hour scan)

What participation gives you:

- Pride for helping OCD research
- A gift card
- Pictures of your brain
