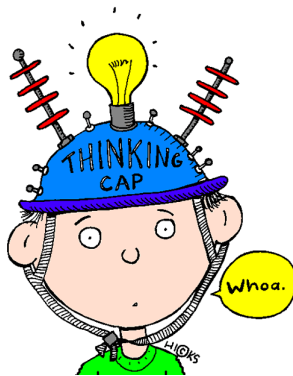


Want to help us learn more about Obsessive-Compulsive Disorder (OCD)?

We are currently looking for **kids and teens with OCD and their siblings as well as control participants** to participate in our Neurocognition Study.



This study looks at how youth who have OCD may think or solve problems in a different way than their unaffected peers.

We invite girls and boys who:

- **Have OCD or have a sibling with OCD or Have never been diagnosed with OCD**
- Are between 6-18 years old
- Are fluent in **English**

What it involves: one **2 to 2.5-hour session**, in which the child will play games on a touch pad using language, memory, attention, and problem-solving skills.

Child receives: a **25\$ gift card** of their choice (e.g., Chapters, Cineplex, iTunes, or ToysRus) AND a letter of recognition of volunteer hours.

Parents receive: **written feedback** report outlining how their child performed in areas such as linguistic knowledge, visual-spatial problem solving, math, writing, spelling compared to same-age/same-grade peers. Parents also receive a **25\$ gift card** for an initial phone interview to see if their child is eligible (interview only applicable to siblings).

Are you interested? The assessment takes place at BC Children's Hospital Research Institute or in the participant's home (whatever is more convenient for the participant).

Study participation is entirely voluntary. All studies are conducted to learn more about OCD in an effort to help children with OCD and their families. The Principal Investigator for these studies is Dr. Evelyn Stewart.
